You might wonder why I have included this picture in my Pastoral Letter. I have three stories from the floods.

The first is about a horse, loved very much by its owner but hurt during the floods and the wound is not healing. The owner is a woman of great faith, a woman who is tireless in working for those who have been impacted by the floods, who has been removing mud from homes and at the same time loves her horse and is greatly concerned for him. She would love prayer for him – I believe he was created as we were by our loving God, and I will pray for him.

The next story is about a 1-year-old kitten. His owner hasn't been able to go back to his property to see if his kitten has survived. This gentleman lives on his own and his kitten means the world to him. I do not know the gentleman's name, but can still pray for him, and all others who are wondering about their beloved pets.

Lastly, I sat with a woman yesterday who told me her story. She had three little dogs, and they were her "family", someone left the gate open, and one escaped onto the road and was killed. She said she doesn't care about the flood damage and the things she has lost, but it is the losing of her little dog that has upset her the most.

There would be many people feeling the loss of pets, and this on top of all the other losses they've experienced, is almost too much to bear.
