Luke12:32-40

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

"Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet, so that when he comes and knocks they can immediately open the door for him. It will be good for those servants whose master finds them watching when he comes. Truly I tell you, he will dress himself to serve, will have them recline at the table and will come and wait on them. It will be good for those servants whose master finds them ready, even if he comes in the middle of the night or

toward daybreak. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him."



A Fresh Look at 'Surprise the World' by Michael Frost

Encouragement for Everyday Evangelism

Many of you will remember reading *Surprise the World* by Michael Frost and participating in small study groups around it not too long ago. It's a book that left a mark on many of us.

I was given a copy by Alison a few months back, but I didn't get around to reading it until a couple of weeks ago. And I'm glad I finally did!

Michael Frost's insights are both encouraging and practical.

He offers us a natural, down-to-earth way of doing evangelism—something we often find intimidating. Let's be honest: many of us cringe when we hear the phrase, "Share your faith in Jesus!" But Frost's approach, built around five simple habits, provides us with practical tools for connection and community-building in everyday life.

Five Habits That Align with Our Vision

Frost's five key habits complement the four core words in our Strategic Mission Plan:

Connection, Community, Commitment, and Christ.

In the coming week, I'll share a short reflection on each habit—as a reminder and encouragement for us all.

Surprise the World!

Living as Everyday Missionaries — A Simple Guide from Michael Frost

What if living out our faith could become a natural part of our everyday lives — not just something we do on Sundays?

In his inspiring little book, Surprise the World: The Five Habits of Highly Missional People, Michael Frost invites us to become people who live questionable lives — lives that cause others to ask why we are so generous, hospitable, and joyful.

The answer? Jesus.

Frost offers a simple but powerful rhythm for daily discipleship and mission, captured in the acronym *BELLS:*



B - Bless

Choose to bless three people this week through a kind word, a thoughtful gift, or an act of service. At least one should be outside your church family.



E – Eat

Share a meal with three people this week. Hospitality is one of the most natural and powerful ways to build relationships and share God's love.



🖊 L – Listen

Spend time each week listening to the Holy Spirit. Turn off distractions and tune in to God's voice—auiding, comforting, and sending you.



L – Learn

Commit to regularly learning about Jesus through Scripture and other resources. Knowing Jesus deeply fuels a life that looks like His.




S - Sent

Reflect each week on how you are sent into the world to represent Christ. Consider keeping a journal or sharing stories with a friend or small group.

These five habits help us develop a missional lifestyle — one that is intentional, Spirit-led and grounded in Jesus. As we live this way, we will naturally surprise the world and invite others into God's story.

Let's practice these habits together as a church family
— not to add more pressure, but to live more
purposefully in the everyday moments God gives us.
